Luis Victorious at World Triathlon Championship Series Bermuda

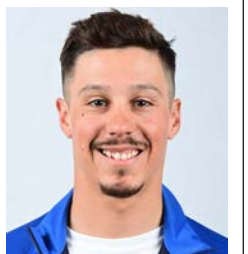
Sunday, November 6th; Bermuda – Vincent Luis claimed the victory at the World Triathlon Championship Series Bermuda on Sunday, thus marking his first WRCS podium performance in a year, and his first gold since Hamburg over two years ago. This victory was sweeter than most, as Vincent has struggled with injury in recent months. “Last year I thought I was done and then I got injured again, but still I’m surrounded by amazing people who believe in me, so I just had to believe in myself as the minimum I could do. The last lap, I was just remembering all the days I couldn’t run,” Luis reflected post-race. After exiting the swim in the eight-strong lead pack, Luis completed a strong bike. He started the run behind the lead pack but quickly closed the gap and maintained his lead to secure the win. Luis’ gold was not the only medal claimed by the NYAC on Sunday – **Taylor Knibb** took second with a finish of 2:03:04 behind the hometown favorite and Tokyo 2020 Olympic champion Flora Duffy who crossed the line in 2:01:26. Beth Potter of Great Britain took third in 2:03:17. On the women’s side, in addition to Taylor Knibb’s silver medal performance, the NYAC’s **Taylor Spivey** finished fifth in 2:04:05, and **Summer Rappaport** finished 25th in 2:08:51. Notably, Summer had the second-fastest swim of the field of 20:18, three seconds behind winner Flora Duffy (20:15). On the men’s side, in addition to Vincent Luis’ victory, the NYAC’s **Matt McElroy** finished 16th in 1:51:09. [Click here](#) for complete results from Bermuda.

Water Polo - US Women Claim FINA World League Super Final Bronze

Sunday, November 6th; Tenerife, Spain - The USA Women’s National Team claimed the bronze medal on Sunday at the FINA World League Super Final after defeating the Netherlands in a shoot-out, 16-15. The first period concluded with a 3-3 score, and the US entered halftime with a 7-4 advantage. After the break, the Dutch scored three times before the NYAC’s **Jordan Raney** brought the score to a 9-7 advantage for the US. In the fourth and final quarter, the Dutch scored three times once more to gain the lead. However, following a goal from Jordan Raney and **Rachel Fattal**, the game went to a shootout. Following successful attempts from Rachel Fattal, Jordan Raney, and fellow teammates, and a decisive save from **Ashleigh Johnson**, Team USA secured the bronze medal with a 16-15 win. Sunday, November 6th, 2022; New York, NY – The NYAC’s **Tatyana McFadden** finished eighth in the women’s wheelchair division at the New York City Marathon on Sunday with a finish of 1:52:59. American Susannah Scaroni won in 1:42:43, Manuela Schar of Switzerland took second in 1:45:11, and Madison de Rozario of Austria took third in 1:45:24. Judo - Battling in Baku

Friday, November 4th – Sunday, November 6th; Baku, Azerbaijan – The NYAC’s **Hannah Martin**, **Katelyn Jarrell**, and **Christian Konoval** each contested their respective weights at the Baku Grand Slam, though none advanced beyond the second round of competition. Katelyn Jarrell (-52kg) defeated Martina Castagnola of Italy by ippon in the first round but was defeated herself by ippon in the second by Aydan Valiyeva of Azerbaijan. At -63kg, the NYAC’s Hannah Martin won the first round against Yesui Darkhanbatbayar of Mongolia by ippon but lost to Lucy Renshall of Great Britain by ippon in the second.
