












NYAC Excels at Pan-American Games

Saturday, October 21st – Wednesday, October 25th; Santiago, Chile - The NYAC's swimmers, Catie DeLoof and Paige Madden, secured 11 medals, collectively, at the 2023 Pan-American Games, which began on Friday, October 20th and which run until Sunday, November 5th. Over the course of the 17-day event, 30 NYAC athletes will contest a variety of sports with the hopes of securing PanAm titles. Paige Madden claimed gold medals in the 400m freestyle, 800m freestyle, and 4x200m freestyle relay, and a silver medal in the mixed 4x100m freestyle relay. Catie DeLoof claimed gold medals in the 4x200m freestyle relay and the mixed 4x100m medley relay, silver medals in the 4x100m freestyle relay, the mixed 4x100m freestyle relay, and the 4x100m medley relay, and bronze medals in the 50m freestyle and 100m freestyle. Click here for full swimming results from the PanAm Games. • Also at the PanAm Games, on Monday, October 23rd, modern pentathlete Jess Davis became the third NYAC athlete, after triathletes Taylor Knibb and Morgan Pearson, to be selected for the Paris 2024 Games, after her fourth-place finish at the 2023 Pan American Games. Jess secured her fourth place finish with 1370 points, with 238 points in fencing, 250 in swimming, 279 in riding, and 603 in the laser run. Mexico's Mayan Oliver won with 1423 points, team-

mate and sister Catherine Oliver took second with 1407 points, and Sophia Hernandez, competing for the Independent Athletes Team, took third with 1385 points. On the men's side, the NYAC's **Brendan Anderson** finished seventh with 1470 points; Mexico's Emiliano Hernandez won with 1534 points. Rowing - Results from the Head of the Charles

Friday, October 20th – Sunday, October 22nd; Cambridge, MA – The NYAC had a strong showing at the historic Head of the Charles Regatta on the Charles River in Cambridge, Massachusetts, with excellent finishes across a plethora of races. Highlights of the action-packed weekend included Eliot Putnam's third place finish in 17:21.545 in the Men's Championship Singles, and the NYAC's fourth (A – Matthew Ptucha, Colin Wilcox, Paul Verni, Connor Corwen, Magdalene Baert) and ninth place (B – Jeffrey Arnott, Ryan Peffers, Edward Gonzalez, William Horvat, Caiti Levin) finishes in the Men's Club Fours in 16:22.403 and 16:50.875, respectively. Notably, the aforementioned NYAC A and B boats were the first and fourth place clubs overall, when excluding universities. With fellow US teammates, Nick Mead claimed the men's eight title with a finish of 14:21.484, and Charlotte Buck, Alina Hagstrom, and Brooke Mooney, with fellow US teammates, claimed the women's eight title with a finish of 16:11.313. The US Rowing "C" boat, with the NYAC's Made-

leine Wanamaker, Erin Reelick, and Claire Collins, took second in the women's eight with a finish of 16:11.528. USRowing took second in the men's and women's elite pair. On the men's side, **Nick Mead** (NYAC) and Alex Karwoski took second with a finish of 16:20.382, and in the women's race, **Kelsey Reelick** (NYAC) and Molly Bruggeman also took second, with a finish of 18:06.427. Also in the women's race, the NYAC's **Erin Reelick** and **Olivia Coffey** finished fourth in 18:29.660. **Click here** for full results from the Head of the Charles.

Judo - Yonezuka Fifth at Abu Dhabi Grand Slam

Tuesday, October 24th – Thursday, October 26th; Abu Dhabi, UAE – The NYAC's Jack Yonezuka finished fifth in the -73kg weight division at the Abu Dhabi Grand Slam. Yonezuka received a bye into the second round, where he defeated Kote Kapanadze of Georgia by ippon. In the third round, he was once again victorious, defeating Jorge Cano Garcia of Spain by waza ari. He did not fare as well in the quarterfinal, losing to Akil Gjakova of Kosovo by waza ari. Yonezuka defeated Jano Ruebo of Germany by ippon to win the repechage and then lost to Rashid Mammadaliyev of Azerbaijan in the bronze medal match to claim his fifth-place finish. Also in Abu Dhabi, Nicolas Yonezuka contested the -81kg division but did not advance beyond the second round, and Hannah Martin contested the -63kg division but did not advance beyond the first round.
