

# Paralympic Games - McFadden and Brannigan Seeking Medals

The Olympic Games are concluded; now it is time to look to the Paralympic Games taking place in Tokyo from Tuesday, August 24th to Sunday, September 5th. The NYAC's Tatyana McFadden, a 17-time Paralympic medalist, and Mikey Brannigan, the 2016 Rio Games T20 1500m champion, will be taking part.
