Athlete Village over the last few days. As we waited in the terminal for our departure to Tokyo from the Honolulu airport last Wednesday, "Somewhere over the Rainbow" came on overhead. It was a rather po-

etic sendoff after what felt like an incredibly quick trip (or just a long layover) in Honolulu....I've been paying closer attention to those little details along the way; making sure to soak it all in just a bit more than I did in Rio. I think this also comes with knowing that this is my last Olympics as an athlete and the finality of that almost forcing me to fully embrace how spectacular this experience is. That being said, the last few days have been a blur as we've been shuffled through a plethora of process and procedure, daily COVID testing (six tests and counting in the last six days alone!), rules review, Team USA processing, etc....on top of trying to adjust to the hot and humid weather and new time zone. We finally got to hit the water yesterday for our first row on the Sea Forest Waterway after spending a couple of days training here in the Village on the machines....As always, thank you all for your support. We're feeling excited and ready to race.

Water Polo - Our Man in Tokyo
