Judo - NYAC Judokas Claim Medals at Pan-American Senior Championships



From Friday, April 15th to Saturday, April 16th, NYAC judokas Dominic Rodriguez, Angie Delgado, Katelyn Jarrell, Christian Konoval, Ari Berliner, Nicholas Yonezuka, Alisha Galles and Jacob More contested the Pan-American Senior Championships in Lima, Peru. 17-year-old Dominic Rodriguez won the -73kg title, defeating Alonso Wong of Peru, a six-time Pan Am medalist, after throwing him for ippon. With this win, Rodriguez became the youngest US judoka to win the Pan Ams in an Olympic weight class since Ronda Rousey in 2004. At 52kg, Angie Delgado finished as runner-up to Larissa Pimenta of Brazil, while NYAC teammate Katelyn Jarrell tied for fifth in the same weight class. This silver medal is Angie's eighth career Pan American Championships medal. Notably, Angie and Katelyn faced each other in the -52kg semi-finals, where Angie took the win to advance to the final. At +100kg, 18-year-old Christian Konoval secured a bronze medal, after defeating Sergio Del Sol of Mexico in the bronze medal final. Andy Granda of Cuba won the weight class. Ari Berliner secured a bronze medal at -66kg after defeating Juan Ayala of Ecuador in the bronze medal final. Eric Takabatake of Brazil won the weight class. Nicholas Yone-zuka and Alisha Galles each finished seventh at -81kg and -63kg, respectively. Jacob More contested the -60kg weight class but did not advance beyond the second round. Track and Field - Allman Named USATF Athlete of the Week

On Thursday, April 14th, NYAC Olympic champion **Valarie Allman** was selected as the <u>USATF Athlete of the Week</u>, the same day she broke her own American record by a foot at the Triton Invitational in La Jolla, CA. Allman's mark of 71.46m/234-5 was the world's best discus throw in 30 years. Click here to learn more. • On Saturday, April 16th, NYAC throwers dominated at the <u>2022 USATF</u> <u>Golden Games at the Mt. SAC Relays</u> in Walnut, CA. **Valarie Allman** won the discus with a throw of 69.46m/227-11, Jorinde Van Klinken of the Netherlands took second, with a throw of 63.38m/207-11. **Rudy Winkler** won the hammer with a throw of 79.11m/259-6, defeating Sweden's Ragnar Carlsson of Sweden by almost 10 feet. **Kara Winger** won the javelin with a throw of 63.29m/207-7 ahead of Ariana Ince (unattached, 58.83m/193-0). **Sam Mattis** placed third in the discus with a throw of 63.71m/209-0. Daniel Stahl of Sweden won with a throw of 67.65m/221-11. **Janeah Stewart** finished fifth in the hammer throw with a mark of 69.55m/228-2. For complete results from the meet, **click here**.
