Triathlon - Luis Hit by Car at Indian Wells, Finishes Second

Vince Luis finished second this past Sunday, December 5th, at IRONMAN 70.3 Indian Wells in La Quinta, CA, despite getting knocked off his bike by a car. Vince, though bruised and bleeding, valiantly finished the "Half Ironman" (HIM) race, consisting of a 1.2 mile swim, a 56 mile bike, and a 13.1 mile run, in 3:41:06.
