Track and Field - Allman Betters Own American Discus Record



RESULTS: On Friday, April 14th, the NYAC's Olympic discus champion, **Valarie Allman**, broke her own American record by a foot, launching a 71.46m/234-5 throw, the world's best discus throw in 30 years. Allman now stands in 15th place on the world all-time list. The NYAC woman made this remarkable throw at the <u>Triton Invitational</u> in La Jolla, CA. At the same meet, the NYAC's Sam Mattis placed third in the men's discus with a throw of 65.05/213-5, a US leader for the season. **COMING UP:** Tomorrow, Saturday, April 16th, the NYAC's **Valarie Allman, Rudy Winkler, Sam Mattis, Kara Winger** and **Janeah Stewart** will contest the <u>2022 USATF Golden Games at the Mt. RESULTS: The NYAC men's team handball team finished fourth in the CPT Scott L. Pace Memorial Tournament, which

was hosted at the United States Military Academy in West Point, NY from Friday, March 25th to Sunday, March 27th. In preliminary rounds, the NYAC

defeated the Toronto Team Handball Club, 31-15, and the Boston Team Handball Club, 21-9, but lost to the West Point Team Handball Club, 24-31. In

the bronze medal match, the winged foot team was defeated by the New York City Team Handball Club, 21-26, installing them in fourth position.
