Rowing

Three NYAC rowers - Nick Mead, Tom Dethlefs and Mike DiSanto - have been invited to the selection camp for the men's eight and four boats that will represent the US at this summer's Tokyo Olympic Games. Twenty rowers were invited to the camp, which begins on March 17th in Oakland, CA. Invitations to the women's selection camp will be announced by April 1st. Triathlon

On March 13th, the NYAC's Eli Hemming placed fifth in the elite men's division in the Sarasota-Bradenton Triathlon, recording a time of 50:02.9 for the 750m/20K/5K course in Sarasota's Nathan Benderson Park. Going to the Games

As of March 15th, 85 athletes had qualified for the US Olympic team, including the NYAC's Summer Rappaport and Amro Elgeziry. Most selections will not take place until considerably closer to the Games' opening on July 23rd. Team USA should have more than 500 athletes making the trip to Tokyo.
