NYAC fencers Kelley Hurley and Kat Holmes were the first and second American finishers, respectively, in the Epée of Kazan World Cup, held from March 19th to 23rd in Kazan, Russia. Overall, Hurley placed in 19th place, and Holmes placed 21st. This competition was the first FIE senior epée World Cup of the 2020-21 season. To find results, please click here. However, following the Kazan competition, the NYAC has four fencers locked into qualification for Tokyo: Jake Hoyle, Kat Holmes, Kelley Hurley and Courtney Hurley.

At the Cornell Invitational in Carbondale, IL on March 20th, the NYAC's Deanna Price launched a world leading throw in the hammer competition, dominating the event and claim victory, reaching a mammoth 252' 0".
