Judo - Yonezuka Makes History at Junior World Championships



Wednesday, August 10th – Sunday, August 14th; Guayaquil, Ecuador - By winning the -73kg bronze medal at the World Junior Championships in Ecuador on August 11th, the NYAC's Jack Yonezuka became the first US man in 30 years to make the Junior World Championships podium. Yonezuka earned his place via a 4-1 defeat over Daniel Szegedi of Hungary. Ryuga Tanaka of Japan took the -73kg gold medal. Yonezuka, thereby, follows in the footsteps of NYAC judo legends Jimmy Pedro and Jason Morris, both Olympic medalists who claimed world junior medals in 1990 and 1986, respectively. Yonezuka was not alone in Ecuador. Also on the roster from the NYAC were Christian Konoval (5th, +100kg) and Alexander Knauf took (7th, -90kg). in addition, Jack's old brother, Nick, took to the mats in the -81kg division, but did not advance beyond the second round.
