Judo - Delgado Secures Third Career Grand Slam Medal



Friday, June 8th-Sunday, June 10th; Budapest, Hungary — The NYAC's Angie Delgado secured her third career Grand Slam medal last weekend, taking the -52kg bronze at the Budapest Grand Slam in Hungary. After defeating local favorite Rebeka Keller and Genfen Primo of Israel in the second round and quarter-final respectively, Delgado lost in the semi-final to Giulia Carna of Italy by ippon (full point). In a high-octane bronze medal match, the NYAC woman defeated fellow winged foot judoka Katelyn Jarrell in a swift 14 seconds to secure the bronze. In addition to Delgado and Jarrell, the NYAC's Ari Berliner (-66kg), Dominic Rodriguez (-73kg), Jack Yonezuka (-73kg), Nicolas Yonzuka (-81kg), Nate Keeve (-100kg), Christian Konoval (+100kg), and Hannah Martin (-63kg) also contested the Budapest Grand Slam. Triathlon - Spivey Fourth in Hamburg



Saturday, July 9th; Hamburg, Germany – Tokyo 2020 Olympian Taylor Spivey placed fourth at the World Triathlon Championship Series Hamburg with an overall time of 58:58. The course consisted of a 750m swim, a 21K bike and a 5K run. Tokyo 2020 Olympic champion Flora Duffy of Great Britain won in 58:37. Also in the women's race, the NYAC's Summer Rappaport finished 26th in 59:57, although she recorded the fastest swim of the day (9:35). On the men's side, Vincent Luis finished 11th in 53:44. Like Rappaport,

Luis had the fastest men's swim of the day (8:45). Hayden Wilde of New Zealand won the men's race in 53:10. Click here for complete results.
