Judo - 2021 IJF Junior World Championships

From October 6th to 9th, brothers Jack and Nicolas Yonezuka contested the 2021 IJF Junior World Champion-ships in Olbia, Italy. Jack won his first two rounds of competition at 66kg, making it to the Round of 16 before being defeated by Robin Jara of Mexico, who made it to the bronze medal match himself. Following a recent move up in weight class to 81kg, Jack's brother Nicolas lost a tough match in the first round to Bright Maddaloni Nosa of Italy, who also ultimately won his way to the bronze medal match.
