Track and Field - DeAnna Price, #3 All-Time

On Saturday, April 10th at the Tom Botts Invitational in Columbia, MO, the NYAC's DeAnna Price improved her own US women's hammer throw record and installed herself as the third farthest female hammer thrower of all time. Thursday, April 15th saw the conclusion of the four-day US Olympic Team Rowing Trials #2, held in West Windsor, NJ. In the men's pair, the NYAC's Michael DiSanto won his final and advances to the Final Olympic Qualification Regatta, being held May 16th-17th in Lucerne, Switzerland. That will be his opportunity to secure his place on the Tokyo team. Olympians, Ellen Tomek and Meghan O'Leary placed third in the women's double, unfortunately missing out on a ticket to Tokyo.
