Paralympic Games Begin - McFadden and Brannigan on the Track



The Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games opened on Tuesday, August 24th. The Games run until Sunday, September 5th with 2,537 Paralympians competing in 22 sports. Team USA sent 240 athletes, including the NYAC's Tatyana McFadden and Mikey Brannigan. Tatyana is a 17-time Paralympic medalist, with four gold medals and two silver medals from 2016 alone. Triathlon - Victory for Knibb in Edmonton



The NYAC's Taylor Knibb won the elite women's race at the 2021 World Triathlon Championship Final Edmonton in a time of 1:54:47. NYAC teammates Katie Zaferes, Taylor Spivey, Kirsten Kasper and Summer Rappaport finished fourth, fifth, 10th and 16th, respectively. Watch highlights of the women's race here. This result meant that Knibb placed second in the 2021 World Triathlon Championship Series Rankings. Only Olympic champion Flora Duffy of Bermuda placed ahead of her. Taylor Spivey was ranked third. Track and Field - Nageotte Keeps Winning

At the Wanda Diamond League Prefontaine Classic in Eugene, OR last weekend (August 21st), Olympic champion Katie Nageotte won the pole vault with a clearance of 4.82m/15'9 3/4". Olympic shot put silver medalist, Joe Kovacs, placed third in that event, and Olympic fourth placer Will Claye replicated that position in the triple jump.
