The NYAC's Ben Kanute placed second in the New York City Triathlon on Sunday, July 11th.

Due to water quality issues in the Hudson River, the swim portion - Kanute's strongest discipline - was eliminated. Even so, the winged foot man competed powerfully, beaten only by Colorado's Jason West by less than one minute. Results are here.

Track and Field - Nageotte Prevails in the Principality

Katie Nageotte positioned herself well for a medal in Tokyo by taking the pole vault crown at the Wanda Diamond League Monaco Meeting on July 9th.

Among those giving best to Nageotte were 2016 Olympic champion Katerina Stefanidi from Greece and 2016 Olympic silver medalist Sandi Morris from the USA. All three will be competing in Tokyo. Monaco results are here.
