The US rowing team, with 11 NYAC members on board, is en route to a holding camp in Honolulu, the first leg of a journey that will culminate in Tokyo. Meghan O'Leary writes: "I'm writing this as I sit on our 10-hour flight from Newark to Honolulu where we will spend the next seven days training and beginning our acclimatization process on our way to Tokyo.



We'll be rowing on the Ala Wai Canal, a 3km protected stretch of water set just inland from Waikiki Beach. There are worse places to row. As we navigated through the airport terminal to our gate this morning, we felt like celebrities as people approached us asking what sport we were, wanting to take pictures and genuinely being ex-

cited to root on Team USA....I wanted to be sure to share some important information about the upcoming Games and how to watch us. [The Tokyo Rowing schedule is here]. To break it down in US time: HEATS: Thursday, July 22nd, 7:30pm-11:10pm ET (likely close to 10:30pm). REPS: Saturday, July 24th 8:00pm-10:40pm ET (likely close to 10pm). Fl-NALS: Monday, July 26th 7:30pm-11pm ET (likely in the 9-10pm window). How to watch: The NBC Sports app is free and it's my understanding that this is likely where you'll find us. If you have cable, NBCSN and/or the Olympic Channel may have us live as well....Go USA - Meghan" And, go NYAC!
