Triathlon - Pearson on Track

An superb second place finish at the World Triathlon Championship Series in Leeds, England on Sunday, June 6th illustrated that the NYAC's Morgan Pearson is on track for a fine performance in Tokyo. The women's race on the same day saw Taylor Spivey place sixth, a similarly powerful performance in a world class field. Track and Field - Athletes on Fire

At the Stumptown Twilight Meet in Portland, OR on June 3rd, Rob Napolitano broke the 28 year old NYAC 1500m record (Bill Burke's 3:35.75 from 1993), placing second in a time of

3:35.63. Russell Dinkins placed 16th in the 800m (1:49.35). Results are here. At the Music City Track Carnival in Nashville, TN from Friday, June 4th-Sunday, June 6th, Katie Nageotte won the women's pole vault (4.85m/15'11"), Russell Dinkins was seventh in the Developmental 800m (1:48.80) and Rob Napolitano was eighth in the 1500m (3:40.69). Moving to the Chula Vista High Performance Meet in Chula Vista, CA on June 6th, Megan Clark placed third in the women's pole vault (4.45m/14/7 1/4"). Results are here. On to the USATF Showcase in Prairie View, TX on June 6th, where NYAC athletes claimed three victories and two third place finishes. Valarie Allman won the women's discus, becoming the first American woman in history to exceed 220' twice in one series. Her winning throw was 67.74/222-3. Gwen Berry won the women's hammer throw (72.80/238-10), the legendary Natasha Hastings took the women's 200m and 400m (23.09, 51.45), Michael Shuey placed third in the men's javelin (77.24/253-5), and Priscilla Frederick-Loomis was third in the women's high jump (1.82/5-11 ½). Judo - World Titles on the Line

The Senior World Judo Championships in Budapest, Hungary began on Sunday, June 6th and go until Sunday, June 13th. The NYAC sent a large contingent of judokas. Men: Adonis Diaz (-60kg), Alex Turner (-73kg), Colton Brown (-90kg), John Jayne (-90kg), Nate Keeve (-kg). Women: Angelica Delgado (-52kg), Katelyn Jarrell (-52kg), Alisha Galles (063kg).
