




Triathlon - Last Chance for Tokyo

This Saturday, May 15th (Friday night, May 14th on the East Coast, USA), the World Triathlon Championship Series Yokohama will be contested in Yokohama, Japan. Eleven NYAC triathletes will be on the starting line: Katie Zaferes, Summer Rappaport, Taylor Spivey, Taylor Knibb, Kirsten Kasper, Renee Tomlin, Morgan Pearson, Matt McElroy, Ben Kanute, Eli Hemming and Vincent Luis. This is the final selection race for the US squad for Tokyo. One women's place is up for grabs and, possibly, two men's. USA Triathlon will fill the remaining positions with discretionary selections. Wrestling

At the World Olympic Games Qualifier last weekend in Sofia, Bulgaria, Jesse Porter and Adam Coon were unsuccessful in trying to qualify their weights for the Tokyo Olympic Games, despite valiant attempts. The NYAC is still sending three powerful wrestlers to compete for Olympic medals: Sarah Hildebrandt (50kg) and five time world champion Adeline Gray (76kg), plus Uzbekistan's Bekzod Abdurakhmonov (74kg, fourth in Rio in 2016). Fencing

At the North American Cup in Richmond, VA (May 6th-9th), several NYAC fencers made it to the podium. Courtney Hurley won the women's épée; Sidarth Kumbla was runner-up in the men's foil, and Ethan Kushnerik (men's épée); Kelley Hurley (women's épée), and Nicole Ross (women's sabre) each finished third. 




Track and Field

On Sunday, May 9th, NYAC tracks stars had top finishes

at the USATF Golden Games at Mount San Antonio College in Walnut, CA. Gwen Berry and Will Claye won the women's hammer throw (73.73/241-10) and men's triple jump (17.15/56 3 ¼), respectively. Katie Nageotte placed second in the women's pole vault (4.70/15-5), a season's best. Full results are here. This weekend, Tatyana McFadden will compete in Nottwil, Switzerland at the Nottwil 2021 World Para Athletics Grand Prix (Friday, May 14th-Sunday, May 16th).
