Judo - NYAC Strikes Double Gold in Ecuador

The **Senior Pan American Open Guayaquil** in Ecuador last weekend (May 21st-22nd) was a hotly contested event. Even so, NYAC judoka secured two golds and one bronze medal, exactly half of the six medals claimed by the US team. The NYAC conquerors were Nicolas Yonezuka (-81kg) and Katelyn Jarrell (-52kg). Jack Yonezuka secured third place in the 66kg division. For results, click here. Notably, in her younger days, Jarrell (née Bouyssou) was renowned for her 1000 push-ups per day routine.

Triathlon - Team Places Still On The Line Last weekend (May 22nd-23rd) at the World Triathlon Cup Lisbon, the NYAC's Kirsten Kasper placed third in a time of

1:59.39. Summer Rappaport, already selected for the US Tokyo team, placed ninth in 2:00.30, with Eli Hemming 24th in the men's race (1:44.29). For a report of the races, click here. One women's and two men's slots remain to be selected on the US Olympic team. The three selected thus far - Summer Rappaport, Taylor Knibb and Morgan Pearson - are all NYAC members. In Rio in 2016, all six US team members were winged foot athletes. Just saying. On May 15th in Yokohama, Ben Kanute placed 37th in the men's competition. Track and Field - A Clash of the Shot Put Titans



At the **USATF Throws Festival** in Tucson, AZ on Saturday, May 22nd, all the attention was on the clash of the shot put titans - Ryan Crouser versus the NYAC's world champion, Joe Kovacs. Both have shown flashes of brilliance this year as they build towards the Olympic Trials and, then, the Olympic Games. On this occasion, Crouser was indomitable, unleashing a heave of 23.01m/75' 6", the third farthest throw of all time. That mark is within Kovacs' hemisphere, though not on this occasion, the NYAC man having to accept second place with a throw of 22.04m/72/ 3 3/4". Kovacs was just one amongst a host of NYAC athletes in action in Tucson. Gwen Berry (76.79/251-11) and Rudy Winkler (81.44/267-2) won the women's and men's hammer throw, respectively. Deanna Price finished third in the hammer throw (75.88/248-11), Kara Winger placed fourth in the javelin,

Sam Mattis was fourth in the discus, Michael Shuey placed fifth in the javelin, and Conor McCullough was sixth in the hammer. The full report is here. At the **USATF Invitational** in Prairie View, TX on Tuesday, May 25th, Priscilla Frederick was second in the high jump, clearing 1.85/6-0 ¾. For results, click here. The USA women's water polo team claimed three victories in three matches against Canada from May 17th to May 21st. Scores in the three games were 13-8, 17-5 and 15-7. Team USA won the first match, 14-9 and the second, on May 26th, 14-7. The NYAC's Ash-

The NYAC's Amro Elgeziry (1494 pts) and Samantha Schultz (1374 pts) each won the **Pentathlon Multisport National Championships**, held in Roswell, NM from May 21st-23rd. This was Schultz' seventh US title and the third consecutive for Elgeziry. These two athletes will contest the World Championships from June 8th-14th before heading to Tokyo for the Olympic Games.
