#### Fencing - Courtney Hurley Secures Silver Medal at National Championships



RESULTS: From Thursday, April 21st to Sunday, April 24th, NYAC fencers secured three medals at the <u>Division I National Championships and April North American Cup</u> held in Charlotte, NC. On day one of the competition, **Sidarth Kumbla** took a silver medal in the junior men's foil and, the following day, placed seventh in Division I men's foil. On the third day of competition, April 23rd, **Courtney Hurley** secured a silver medal in Division I women's epée, defeated in the final by Kasia Nixon of the Peter Westbrook Foundation/Fencers Club. On the fourth and final day of the championships, April 24th, **Ethan Kushnerik** claimed a bronze medal in Division I men's epée, tying with Jonas Hansen of Harvard University/Olympia Fencing Center. Tristian Szapary of the Fencers Club Incorporated/Fencing Academy of Philadelphia took the title. The NYAC's **Justin Yoo** and **Ryan Griffiths** finished sixth and seventh, respectively. **Click here** for complete results.

#### Track and Field - Melville Takes US 20K Title

RESULTS: On Sunday, April 24th, Miranda Melville won the 2022 USATF 20K Race Walking National Championships in Hauppauge, NY, with a finishing time of 1:36:01. Natalia Alfonzo took second in 1:37:23, and Maria Michta-Coffey took third in 1:39:55. In the men's race, the NYAC's Emmanuel Corvera secured a bronze medal with a time of 1:32:13. #### Swimming - Held Qualifies for World Championships



**RESULTS/UPCOMING:** On Tuesday, April 26th, the <u>Phillips 66 International Team Trials</u> got underway in Greensboro, NC. This competition serves as the qualifying meet for Team USA for the 2022 FINA World Championships which will be held in Budapest, Hungary from June 17th – July 3rd. Over 450 athletes will compete at the Trials, including NYAC swimmers **Ryan Held, Emily Escobedo, Gabby DeLoof** and **Paige Madden**. As of the morning of April 28th, Held had already qualified for Team USA (4x100mFS relay) after finishing third in the A final of the 100m freestyle (48.18 seconds) on April 26th. Caeleb Dressel won the race in 47.79. Also at

the time of writing, Escobedo, DeLoof and Held had placed well in several B finals. Click here for live results. Check back next week for complete results. The meet will conclude on Saturday, April 30th.

#### Triathlon - Action in St. Petersburg

**UPCOMING:** On Sunday, May 1st, NYAC triathletes **Ben Kanute** and **Kevin Collington** will contest the <u>St. Anthony's Triathlon</u> in St. Petersburg, FL. #### Wrestling - 2022 Pan-American Championships

RESULTS/UPCOMING: On Wednesday, April 27th, the 2022 US Senior Open Wrestling Championships began in Las Vegas, NV. This meet, which runs until Sunday, May 1st, serves as a qualifier for the World Championships Team Trials, which will be held in Coralville, IA from May 21st-22nd. NYAC wrestlers will contest all three styles in Las Vegas – men's freestyle and Greco Roman, and women's freestyle. Top-seeded NYAC wrestlers include Anthony Ashnault (70kg) and Muhamed McBryde (79kg) in men's freestyle; Peyton Omania (67kg), Alan Vera (87kg), Khymba Johnson (97kg) and Lenny Merkin (67kg) in Greco-Roman; and Erin Golston (50kg) and Skylar Grote (72kg) in women's freestyle. Team Trials, click here. **UPCOMING:** Next week, **Skylar Grote** (FS 72kg), **Sarah Hildebrandt** (FS 50kg), **Sammy Jones** (GR 63kg), **Ben Provisor** (GR 82kg), **Ravaughn Perkins** (GR 77kg) and **Tanner Farmer** (GR 130kg) will contest the <u>2022 Pan-American Championships</u> from Thursday, May 5th to Sunday, May 8th in Acapulco, Mexico. All 30 weight classes across the three Olympic styles – men's freestyle and Greco Roman, women's freestyle – will be contested, with one American in each of the 30 divisions. This tournament will serve as a qualifier for the 2023 Pan American Games, which will be hosted in Santiago, Chile from November 1st-4th, 2023.
