Triathlon - Knibb Wins Ironman Oceanside 70.3

On Saturday, April 2nd, Taylor Knibb won the elite women's race at Ironman Oceanside 70.3 in Oceanside, CA. The NYAC woman dominated the half Ironman distance race with a finishing time of 4:06:32, crossing the line over two minutes ahead of second place finisher Luisa Baptista from Brazil, who finished in 4:08:45. Holly Lawrence from Great Britain placed third in 4:09:17. Knibb led out of the water, in 23:22 for 1.2 miles/1.9K, with the pack



close behind her. About an hour into the 56 mile/90K bike segment, she had gained 90 seconds on Baptista, and, by the end of the ride, she had a three-minute advantage, having covered the stage in 2:20:17. Knibb held her lead comfortably in the 13.1 mile/21.1K run, which she completed in 1:17:48, affording her a resounding victory. For a full report of the women's race, click here.

Ben Kanute placed fifth in the elite men's race, with a finishing time of 3:46:32. Canadians Jackson Laundry and Lionel Sanders placed first and second with respective times of 3:45:00 and 3:45:33; Rodolphe Von Berg of the USA took third in 3:45:55, and Alistair

Brownlee of Great Britain placed fourth in 3:45:55. Kanute led out of the water with a 22:28 split time, stayed with the lead pack courtesy of a 2:08:11 bike stage, and recored a time of 1:11:58 for the run. From Friday, April 1st to Saturday, April 2nd, NYAC wrestlers Anthony Ashnault, Sam Jones, Lenny Merkin, Ravaughn Perkins, Jesse Porter, Ben Provisor, and Alan Vera contested the 2022 Bill Farrell Memorial Invitational in Cedar Falls, lowa and achieved fantastic results. Freestyle wrestler Anthony Ashnault secured a silver medal at 70kg/154lbs. Tyler Berger of TMWC/CA RTC, a three-time NCAA All-American, defeated the Anthony, the 2019 NCAA champion, in the final, 6-6. In Greco-Roman, three NYAC wrestlers won their events, two took second place, and one took bronze. Sam Jones defeated Jesse Thielke of WCAP, 9-0, to win at 63kg/138.6lbs. Ravaughn Perkins defeated fellow NYAC

wrestler Jesse Porter to win at 77kg/169.4lbs, 6-0. Ben Provisor defeated Spencer Woods of WCAP, 2-1, to win at 82kg/180.4lbs, and Alan Vera took silver at 86kg/190lbs, after losing to Richard Carlson of Minnestota Storm in the final. Delgado, Diaz and Yonezuka were each eliminated in the first round of competition - Delgado by Jessica Lima of Brazil, Diaz by Yashar Naijafov of Azerbaijan, and Yonezuka by Adrian Sulca of Romania.
