## Track and Field - Franklin to Jump at World Indoor Championships

This Sunday, March 20th, Tokyo 2020 Olympian **Tori Franklin** will contest the triple jump at the <u>World Athletics Indoor Championships</u> in Belgrade, Serbia. The championships run from Friday 18th, to Sunday 20th. Seventeen triple jumpers from 15 countries are registered for the event, including Tori and fellow US teammate, Keturah Orji. Tori presently holds the indoor and outdoor American records of 14.64m/48-0.5 and 14.84m/48-8.25, respectively. For a complete schedule of the championships, **click here**. # Triathlon - Kasper Wins Americas Triathlon Cup

Kirsten Kasper won the women's division of the Americas Triathlon Cup Sarasota-Bradenton in Sarasota, FL on Sunday, March 13th. The race - a super sprint – comrpised a 350m swim, a 12.2K bike, and a 2.5K run. Kasper finished in 32:47, Emy Legault of Canada took second in 32:50, and Rachel Klamer of the Netherlands rounded out the podium in 32:55. This was Kirsten's first career Americas Cup win. Ben tailed close behind leaders Jonas Schomburg of Germany and Aaron Royle of Australia on the 1K swim, pulled to the front and led most of the 64.5K bike, and then maintained connection throughout the 16.5K run to fin-

Erin scored a takedown in the first period, followed by a step out from Shilson, and Erin led 2-1 into the break. In the second period, Shilson scored a second step out, bringing the score to 2-2.
