Kate Douglass - World Champion

Tuesday, December 13th – Sunday, December 18th; Melbourne, Australia – The NYAC's Kate Douglass claimed the 200m medley world title at the FINA Short Course (35m) World Swimming Championships on Tuesday, December 13th with an American record finish of 2:02.12, taking 1.94 seconds off of the prior American record. The 21-year-old grew up in Pelham, NY and is a current student-ath-lete at the University of Virginia. Fellow American Alex Walsh took the silver in 2:03.37, and Kaylee McKeown of Australia took the bronze in 2:03.57. Also that day, Kate secured a silver medal, with American teammates Torri Huske, Claire Curzan, and Erika Brown in the 4x100m Freestyle Relay in a time of 3:26.29. Australia won in 3:25.43, and Canada took third in 3:28.06. The following day, on Wednesday, December 14th, Kate claimed yet another world title, this time in the mixed 4x50m medley relay with fellow USA teammates Nic Fink, Torri Huske, and Ryan Murphy. The Americans touched the wall in 1:35.15, a new world record. Italy took second in 1:36.01, and Canada took third in 1:36.93. The Short Course World Championships run through Sunday. Following her exceptional results, Kate told NYAC Athletics News, "I am so excited about my 200 IM world title. Being able to start off the meet with such a dominant swim is a great feeling, and I'm going to carry that momentum with me throughout the week.



Wrestling - Jackson and Golston at World Cup

Saturday, December 10th – Sunday, December 11th; Coralville, IA – The NYAC's Nate Jackson (92kg) and Erin Golston (50kg) had excellent performances at the World Cup last weekend, each contributing to Team USA's success at the international dual meet-style tournament. The US faced Mongolia, Georgia, Iran, Japan, and the All-World Team. The US men secured the win, and the US women took the bronze medal. Nate went 3-0 for his matches, and Erin, 1-1. Triathlon - Luis, Champion of 70.3 Bahrain

Friday, December 9th; Bahrain - The NYAC's Vincent Luis won IRONMAN 70.3 Bahrain, thus securing his third major win in the last two months. He com-

pleted the course, which consisted of a 1.9K swim, a 90K bike, and a 21.1K run, in 3:38:02. Great Britain's Samuel Dickinson took second in 3:40:01, and Maximillian Sperl of Germany took third in 3:40:35. To read more about Vincent's race. click here.

Rugby - Baker and Tomasin Secure Bronze for Team USA

Sunday, December 11th; Cape Town, South Africa – The NYAC's Perry Baker and Steve Tomasin secured bronze medals with the USA Rugby Sevens team in the Cape Town, South Africa leg of the HSBC World Rugby Sevens Series. The USA defeated Uganda, England, and Fiji, and tied Australia, before losing to New Zealand in the semifinals. A 22-14 win over South Africa secured the bronze medal for the Americans. Saturday, December 3rd; Boston, MA – The NYAC's Aisha Leer finished sixth in the indoor 5000m in a time of 15:19:21 at the 2022 Boston University Sharon Colyear Danville Season Opener, setting the Jamaican national record.
