Track & Field - Four NYAC Medals at World Championships

Friday, July 15th-Sunday, July 24th; Eugene, OR - The NYAC had an outstanding showing at the 2022 World Athletics Championships in Eugene, Oregon. Joe Kovacs won shot put silver, Valarie Allman claimed a discus bronze, Tori Franklin took a bronze in the triple jump and Kara Winger secured the silver medal in the javelin. Allman and Winger are the first American females ever to win medals in their events at a world championships. For Winger, a four-time Olympian and six-time world championships competitior, it was the first major championships medal of her career, claimed on her last throw of the competition and, ostensibly, the last world championship throw of her career, as she plans to retire after this season. Only five countries secured more medals than the NYAC's four at these world championships (USA-33; Ethiopia-10; Jamaica-10; Kenya-10; China-6). Triathlon - Sarah True Takes Lake Placid Gold

Sunday, July 24th; Lake Placid, NY - The NYAC's Sarah True won the Ironman Lake Placid, consisting of a 2.4-mile swim, a 112-mile bike and a 26.2-mile run, with a finishing time of 9:00:22. Water Polo - Super League Silver for US Men

Friday, July 22nd-Wednesday, July 27th; Strasbourg, France – The US men's team secured the silver medal at the FINA World Super League Final on Wednesday, July 27th, after a 13-9 loss to Italy. The US roster included the NYAC's Alex Bowen, Matt Farmer, Sawyer Rhodes and Ben Stevenson, with Bowen scoring four goals. The US went 4-2 for the series, with two wins in the preliminary round (Canada, Italy), wins in the quarter-final (Australia), and semi-final (France). Extreme NYAC Sports - On Wednesday, August 10th at 8:30am, NYAC member Antonio Arguelles will attempt to swim around Manhattan...twice. If he succeeds, he will become

the first person ever to complete the Triple Crown of open water swimming three times. The Triple Crown consists of swimming around Manhattan and swimming the

Catalina and English Channels. At 63 years of age and if successful, Arguelles will also become the oldest person to have completed a double round-Manhattan swim.

The attempt will take place during the New York Open Water 40 Bridges race, a 57-mile route, beginning at either Pier One or Mill Rock, heading around Manhattan
