Triathlon - Pearson at Vina del Mar World Triathlon Cup

Sunday, November 13th; Vina del Mar, Chile – The NYAC's Morgan Pearson finished 50th in a time of 54:39 in the 2022 World Triathlon Cup Vina del Mar, his first race of the year. The sprint distance triathlon consisted of a 750m swim, an 18.6K bike, and a 5K run. Vina del Mar, meaning "Vineyard of the Sea" in Spanish, is a city on the Pacific coastline of central Chile. David Castro Fajardo of Spain won the sprint-distance race in 50:52. Pearson, who secured a silver medal in the mixed relay at the 2020 Tokyo Games, grew up in Harding, NJ and ran competitively at the Delbarton School.

Fencing - Holmes and Cebula Contest Tallin Coupe du Monde

Sunday, November 13th; Tallin, Estonia - The NYAC's Kat Holmes and Anne Cebula finished 33rd and 53rd overall in the women's epee competition, respectively, at the Tallin Coupe du Monde. Each secured two points. Alberta Santuccio of Italy won with 32 points. Italy won the team competition, and the American women took seventh. Holmes, a two-time Olympian (2016, 2020), won the world championships gold medal in the 2018 epee team competition, the first world championship medal won by an American women's epee team in history.
