Taylor Knibb Crowned 70.3 World Champion. Kanute Takes Second

Friday, October 28th; St. George, Utah – The NYAC's Taylor Knibb took the world title at the IRONMAN 70.3 World Championships last Friday with a dominant 4:03.20 finish for the half IRONMAN distance (1.9K swim, 90K bike, 21.1K run). Knibb finished over five minutes ahead of silver medalist Canadian Paula Findlay, who crossed the finish in 4:08.57. Emma Pallant-Browne of Great Britain took third in 4:10.45, and 2022 world champion Lucy Charles-Barclay of Great Britain placed fourth in 4:11.24. Coming out of the swim on the heels of Charles-Barclay, Knibb had a slow transition before proving her strength on the bike; 20K into the 90K ride, she had a 1:13 lead on the chasing pack. At the conclusion of her 2:14.41 ride, Knibb was 6:44 ahead of her opponents, and she did not look back, maintaining her large lead on the run, in fact extending it to 7:32 within the first 5K. The chasing pack ultimately began closing, but Knibb was never threatened, finishing the run in 1:21.48 and securing the world title. The following day, the NYAC's Ben Kanute claimed the silver medal in the men's division, sticking with the pack for the swim and bike segments before making a move on the run that saw him pass #1-ranked Kristian Blummenfelt of Norway and move into a lead that he held until the closing 5K. It was at that point that Blummenfelt took advantage of a downhill sweep to surge back into the lead and claim the world title in a time of 3:37.12. Kanute crossed the line less than a minute later in a time of 3:38.01, with Magnus Ditlev of Denmark taking third in 3:39.52. This is the second IRONMAN 70.3 world championships silver
