## Triathlon - McElroy Victorious in Tongyeong

**Saturday, October 15th; Tongyeong, South Korea** – The NYAC's **Matt McElroy** was victorious at the 2022 World Triathlon Cup Tongyeong with a finishing time of 1:44:49 for the 1.5K swim, 40K bike and 10K run. Gabor Faldum of Hungary placed second in 1:45:09, and Samuel Dickinson of Great Britain took third in 1:45:16. After clocking an 18:31 1500m swim, McElroy came out of the water in 49th place, nearly a minute behind leader Nathan Lessmann, who ultimately did not finish the race. Next came the 40K bike, which McElroy completed in 54:27. Though he was over a minute behind the trio of leaders - Jack Willis (GBR), Ricardo Batista (POR) and Jumpei Furuya (JPN) - McElroy worked on closing the gap. During the 10K run, he and Faldum surged into the leading positions. With a strong kick, McElroy claimed the victory with the fastest run of the race – 30:56. • **Saturday, October 8th; Cagliari, Italy** – The NYAC's **Taylor Knibb** secured a bronze medal – the first US World Triathlon Championship Series medal of the season – with a 1:47:32 finish at the 2022 WTCS Cagliari race. Georgia Taylor-Brown of Great Britain won in 1:47:42, and Emma Lombardi of France took second in 1:47:54. The NYAC's **Kirsten Kasper** and **Summer Rappaport** finished sixth and 27th, respectively. Notably, Rappaport had the second-fastest 1500m swim of the race (19:40) and Knibb had the second-fastest 38K bike (53:47) leg. For results from Cagliari, [click here](#).

## Judo - World Championships Conclude

**Thursday, October 6th – Wednesday, October 12th; Tashkent, Uzbekistan** – Wrapping up all the NYAC news from the World Judo Championships, which concluded last Wednesday, after defeating Djamilia Silva of Cape Verde by ippon in the second round, **Katelyn Jarrell** (-52kg) advanced to the third round of the World Judo Championships, where she was defeated by Chelsie Giles of Great Britain by ippon. Giles went on to secure the silver medal; Uta Abe of Japan won the weight class. Also in the -52kg category, the NYAC's **Angie Delgado** was defeated in the second round by Yerin Jung of Korea by waza-ari. **Hannah Martin** (-63kg), **Nick Yonezuka** (-81kg) and **Alex Knauf** (-90kg) were all defeated in their second rounds of competition. **Adonis Diaz** (-60kg), **Dominic Rodriguez** (-73kg), **Jack Yonezuka** (-73kg) and **Christian Konoval** (+100kg) did not advance beyond the first round.
