Triathlon - Spivey Takes Super League Triathlon Gold in Malibu



Saturday, September 17th; Malibu, California – The NYAC's Taylor Spivey won the 2022 Super League Triathlon Championships Series Malibu, an "Eliminator" style race which consisted of three rounds of a 300m swim, a 3.6K bike, and a 1.6K run, with short breaks in between each round. Spivey finished third in the first round, behind Beth Potter and Georgia Taylor Brown of Great Britain. The second round saw the NYAC's Summer Rappaport, Miriam Casillas Garcia of Spain, and Spivey claim the top three places. In the third and final round, Spivey — formerly an ocean lifeguard — dominated the swim, maintained her position in the bike, and finished the run six seconds ahead of silver medalist Casillas and bronze medalist Taylor-Brown to take the win. Summer Rappaport finished fourth overall. The win was particularly special for Spivey, as she grew up nearby in Redondo Beach, CA, and family and friends were able to cheer her on to her victory. Harrison Tsavaris and Justin Stevens in the lightweight men's pair. All have advanced beyond initial heats and have begun contesting semi-finals. Thus far, Claire Collins and Maddie Wanamaker have advanced to the women's pair final (9/24) after finishing second in the A/B 2 semifinal in a time of 7:15.09.
