Wrestling - Hildebrandt, Vera and Provisor Make World Team

Wednesday, June 8th; Madison Square Garden, New York, NY- At the Final X tournament at Madison Square Garden on Wednesday night, Sarah Hildebrandt and Alan Vera punched their tickets to the 2022 World Wrestling Championships, which will be held from September 10th-18th in Belgrade, Serbia. Ben Provisor secured his 82kg Greco-Roman team spot at the Final X Stillwater in Oklahoma on June 4th. In the best-of-three series, Hildebrandt (50kg), the Tokyo 2020 Olympic bronze medalist and two-time world championships silver medalist, defeated Alyssa Lampe of Sunkist Kids with two 10-0 technical superiority wins, thus securing her place on her fifth consecutive world championships team. In the 87kg Greco-Roman division, Vera took care of business quickly, pinning Timothy Young of Illinois at 1:00 in the first match, and earning a 9-1 technical fall at 2:49 in the second, thus making his second consecutive world championships team. In the Stillwater Final X, Provisor scored an 8-0 technical fall over Spencer Woods (Army WCAP) in the first match, before clinching the second bout, 5-2. Track and Field - Kovacs Wins in Rome

Thursday, June 9th; Rome, Italy – Reigning world champion Joe Kovacs won the shot put at yesterday's Diamond League Rome meeting with a throw of 21.85m/71'8 1/4". Filip Mihaljevic from Croatia took second with a season's best throw of 21.18m/69'6"; Konrad Bukowiecki from Poland took third with a mark of 21.18m/69'6". For complete results, click here. This year's World Championships will take place in Eugene, OR from July 15th to 24th. The shot put clash promises to be as intense as it was at the last world championships in 2019, where Kovacs prevailed. For all the details, click here. In earlier results, on Friday, June 3rd in Bydgoszcz, Poland, Kovacs placed second in the shot put at the Irina Szewinska Memorial with a throw of 21.76m/71'4 3/4". Tom Walsh of New Zealand claimed the win with a mark of 21.80m/71'6 1/4". For complete results, click here. On Sunday, June 5th in Chorzow, Poland at the Kusocinski Memorial meet, the NYAC man again placed second, this time with a throw of 22.00m/72'2 1/4". Friday, June 3rd – Sunday, June 5th; Tbilisi, Georgia - At the Tbilisi Grand Slam in Georgia, Angie Delgado (-52kg) placed seventh, after defeating Mari Makharashvili (GEO) by ippon (full point) in the second round. In the quarter-final, Estrella Lopez Sheriff (ESP) prevailed by ippon, sending Delgado to the repechage. In that round, the NYAC woman met defeat by ippon at the hands of Leonie Gonzalez (FRA). Two-time world championships team member Hannah Martin (63kg) also placed seventh. In the first round, she defeated Samalay Yergaliyeva (KAZ) by ippon, then lost to Ketleyn Quadros (BRA) by waza-ari (half point) in the quarter-final.
