TRACK AND FIELD - NYAC CLAIMS THREE MEDALS AT 2023 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS SO FAR

Saturday, August 19th - Sunday, August 27th; Budapest, Hungary - Over the past week, 15 NYAC track and field athletes have taken to the throwing circles, jumping pits, and more in the Hungarian capital at the 2023 World Track and Field Championships, and thus far, they have secured three world medals - Joe Kovacs claimed the bronze medal in the shot put on Saturday, August 19th, Valarie Allman claimed the silver medal in the discus on Tuesday, August 22nd, and Deanna Price claimed the hammer throw bronze medal on Thursday, August 24th. In the men's shot put, Joe secured his bronze medal with a mark of 22.12m. American teammate Ryan Crouser won with a mark of 23.51m, and Italian Leonardo Fabbri won with a personal best of 22.34m. In the women's discus, Valarie claimed the silver medal with a mark of 69.23m. Fellow American Laulauga Tausaga won with a four meter personal best of 69.49m, and China's Bin Feng took third with a season's best of 68.20m. Notably, Valarie had the second, third, fourth, and fifth best throws of the night. In the women's hammer throw, Deanna began the competition with two fouls but recorded a 73.28m mark on her third round to move up to seventh place. Her fourth throw of 72.62m was not an improvement, but come the fifth round, Deanna launched a superb 75.41m that moved her to the bronze medal position, where she remained, despite a 73.98m mark on her sixth throw. Deanna's performance was especially notable, as she has been on a long, two-year path to recovery fol-

lowing injury and surgery. In addition to Joe, Valarie, and Deanna, many other Club athletes have achieved excellence in Budapest in their respective events. Daniel Haugh and Rudy Winkler finished sixth and eighth, with marks of 78.64m and 76.04m, respectively, in the hammer throw. Will Claye took seventh in the triple jump with a season's best mark of 16.99m. Miranda Melville finished 35th in the 35K race walk in 3:09:41, and Nick Christie finished 41st in the 20K race walk in a season's best time of 1:26:21. Brooke Andersen (hammer throw), Maggie Malone (javelin), Sam Mattis (discus), and Rob Napolitano (1500m) also contested their respective events but did not advance beyond preliminary rounds. NYAC action in Budapest remains with Tori Franklin in the triple jump final on Friday, August 25th at 1:38pm EST, Chris Nilsen in the pole vault final on Saturday, August 26th at 1:25pm,

Rugby - Baker and Tomasin Qualify for Paris 2024



Judo - Laborde and Delgado in Zagreb

Friday, August 18th - Sunday, August 20th; Zagreb, Croatia - At the Zagreb Grand Prix, the NYAC's Maria Laborde (-48kg) and Angie Delgado (-52kg) each finished seventh in their respective weights. Maria received a bye into the second round, where she defeated Katryna Esposito of Malta by ippon in 1:01. However, she was not as lucky in the quarter-final, losing to Andrea Stojadinov of Serbia by ippon. In the repechage, Maria was once again defeated by ippon, this time by Abiba Abuzhakynova of Kazakhstan. Angie also received a bye into the second round of competition, where she defeated Faiza Aissahine of Algeria by waza ari. Angie was also victorious in the third round, where she defeated Ariane Toro Soler of Spain by waza ari. However, she did not fare as well in the quarter-final and repechage, losing by ippon to Naomi Van Krevel of the Netherlands and Anja Stangar of Slovakia, respectively.
