Medal Haul for McFadden and Brannigan

Saturday, July 8th – Monday, July 17th; Paris, France – The NYAC's 20-time Paralympic medalist, **Tatyana McFadden**, and 2016 Paralympic Games gold medalist, **Mikey Brannigan**, secured five medals, collectively, at the 2023 World Handisport Athletics Championships in Paris. McFadden claimed a silver medal in the T54 400m (53.15) and bronze medals in the T54 100m (16.11) and 800m (1:46.51). In the T54 400m, she was beaten to the line by Manuela Schaer of Switzerland, who finished in 52.22. These constituted McFadden's 21st, 22nd and 23rd world championships medals. Brannigan claimed a silver medal in the T20 1500m, finishing in 3:53.50, behind winner Ben Sandilands of Great Britain (3:52.42). Also in Chorzow, the NYAC's **Rudy Winkler**, enjoying a powerful summer season, took second in the men's hammer throw (78.11m/256-3), while **Chris Nilsen** took third in the men's pole vault (5.81m/19-0.75), **Joe Kovacs** took an uncharacteristic seventh in the men's shot put (20.88m/68-6), and **Tori Franklin** placed eighth in the women's triple jump (13.49m/44-3.25). Paris 2024 - One Year To Go



Wrestling - Hildebrandt Prevails at UWW Ranking Series

Thursday, July 13th – Sunday, July 16th; Budapest, Hungary – The NYAC's Tokyo 2020 Olympic bronze medalist, Sarah Hildebrandt, won the 50kg division at the <u>United World Wrestling Ranking Series</u> after defeating Ziqi Feng of China, 4-2. Joe Wedra of USA Wrestling wrote, "*Hildebrandt...was almost untouchable all day, outscoring her opponents 39-1 going into the finals. In the championship bout, she used a pair of first-period scores and tough late defense to notch [the] win.*" Also at 50kg, the NYAC's **Erin Golston** defeated Gabija Dilyte of Lithuania, 5-1, but did not advance beyond the 1/8 round. The NYAC's **Patrick Smith** (72kg GR), **Zac Braunagel** (87kg GR) and **Adam Coon** (130kg GR) did not advance beyond the qualification round. Click here to read more about the UWW Ranking Series.

Triathlon - Spivey Seventh in Hamburg

Sunday, July 16th; Hamburg, Germany – Taylor Spivey was the NYAC's top individual finisher in the 'Super Sprint' division at the World Triathlon Sprint and Relay Championships, placing seventh in a top class field. The unique race format consisted of qualifying rounds followed by a three-round shootout, comprising a 300m swim, a 2.5K bike, and a 1.75K run. Summer Rappaport placed 10th, Kirsten Kasper was 14th, and Katie Zaferes was 18th.

On the men's side, Matt McElroy finished 26th and Morgan Pearson took 31st. Team USA, including Spivey, McElroy and Rappaport, placed fourth in the Mixed Relay. Click here for full results.

Water Polo - Action Underway at World Aquatics Championships

Friday, July 14th – Sunday, July 30th; Fukuoka, Japan – The 2023 World Aquatics Championships are presently underway in Fukuoka, Japan and, already, the NYAC's water polo players are in action. Thus far, the US women have defeated China, 15-6, and Australia, 8-5, in preliminary matches that took place on Saturday, July 15th and Tuesday, July 18th, respectively. The US men have defeated Kazakhstan, 18-5, and Australia, 16-8, in preliminary matches on Sunday, July 16th and Wednesday, July 19th. Over the coming days, the women and men will continue to contest matches with the hope of competing in finals on Friday, July 28th (women) and Saturday, July 29th (men). On the men's roster from the NYAC are Alex Bowen, Max Irving and Ben Stevenson. On the women's squad are Ash-

leigh Johnson, Maddie Musselman, Rachel Fattal, Maggie Steffens, Ryann Neushul, Kaleigh Gilchrist, Bayley Weber, Jordan Raney and Amanda Longan. Click here for more from Japan.
