



Swimming - Douglass, Held, Armstrong Qualify for Worlds

Tuesday, June 27th – Saturday, July 1st; Indianapolis, IN – Following their performances at the [2023 Phillips 66 Swimming National Championships](#) last week, the NYAC's **Kate Douglass** (100m freestyle, 200m breaststroke, 200m IM), **Ryan Held** (4x100m freestyle, 50m freestyle), and **Hunter Armstrong** (100m backstroke, 50m backstroke) were each selected in their respective events for the upcoming 2023 World Aquatics Championships, which will be contested in Fukuoka, Japan from July 14th – 30th. NYAC highlights of the multi-day meet included Kate Douglass' wins in the 100m freestyle and 200m IM, second place finish in the 200m breaststroke, and third place finishes in the 100m butterfly and 50m freestyle, Ryan Held's win in the 50m freestyle, and Hunter Armstrong's win in the 100m backstroke and second place finish in the 50m backstroke. Notably, Kate's winning time in the 100m freestyle of 52.57 makes her the second-fastest American performer of all time and ninth fastest in the world of all time. Also notable, this is the first time that Ryan has qualified for a world team in an individual event. The NYAC's **Catie DeLoof** and **Paige Madden** also competed in Indianapolis, with highlights of a sixth place finish in the 50m freestyle and fourth place finish in the 400m freestyle, respectively. Water Polo - US Men Claim World Cup Bronze After Appeal

Friday, June 30th – Sunday, July 2nd; Los Angeles, CA – The US Men's National Team secured a bronze medal at the [Men's Water Polo World Cup](#) after defeating Hungary, 14-13. USA Water Polo reported on the exciting match earlier this week – "In a game that saw the final 4:24 replayed due to an appeal, Team USA earned the bronze medal of the World Aquatics Men's Water Polo World Cup, besting Hungary 14-13. Prior to the re-start, Hungary defeated Team USA in a penalty shootout 18-16. Following the initial conclusion of the match, an appeal was registered concerned a possession in the fourth quarter. At 4:24 during the fourth quarter of the regulation period, Team USA drew an exclusion and a subsequent penalty shot. Hungary blocked the penalty shot and the player from the exclusion corner was waived in. The teams were then "even", even though there was :07 left for the player in the exclusion. USA appealed; it was deemed a "correctable error" and determined to be replayed from the spot of the error. It was determined the match would be replayed following the conclusion of the gold medal match, which Spain won over Italy 10-4. Max Irving restarted the game by cashing in on the re-do of a penalty shot to even the score at 13. Team USA goalie Adrian Weinberg had two momentous saves on the next Hungary possession to preserve the tie. The next two minutes were scoreless, but USA's Ryder Dodd came away with a steal to set up an USA possession with 90 seconds remaining. After a power play went for naught, USA regained the ball for Ben Hallock to break free at center and power in the game-winner with :40 remaining. Hungary then drew an exclusion to set up a monumental power play opportunity with :20 remaining, but the shot was off the mark. USA was able to run out the clock with :11 left and seal the victory." Track and Field - National Championships Underway - Mattis and Franklin Crowned as National Champions - Exciting Finals to Come

Thursday, July 6th – Sunday, July 9th; Eugene, Oregon – In the first day of competition of the [USATF Outdoor Championships](#), the NYAC's **Sam Mattis** and **Tori Franklin** were crowned as national champions in the men's discus and women's triple jump, respectively. Sam Mattis recorded a 65.93m/216-3 mark on his fifth throw of the men's discus competition to edge out second place finisher Turner Washington of Arizona State (65.60m/215-3), and third place finisher Brian Williams of Tracsmith (63.36m/207-10). Tori Franklin's mark of 14.44m/47-4 1/2, recorded on her second jump of the competition, secured the triple jump victory; Keturah Orji of Mizuno took a close second with 14.43m/47-4 1/4, and Jasmine Moore of Florida took third with 14.19m/46-6 3/4.
