Triathlon - Taylor Spivey Claims Bronze in Cagliari

Saturday, May 27th; Cagliari, Italy - The NYAC's Taylor Spivey secured the bronze medal at 2023 World Triathlon Championship Series Cagliari with a finish of 1:47:36. With her results from Cagliari, Spivey took the overall lead in the 2023 WTCS season rankings. The Redondo Beach, CA native completed the 1500m swim in 18:17, the 38K bike in 54:41, and the 10K run in 33:38. Spivey's excellent performance was described by USA Triathlon: "Long known for her consistency and skill across all three disciplines, Spivey executed a near-perfect swim, bike and run on Saturday in Cagliari. She was among the leaders out of the water, and charged ahead in the lead bike pack to dictate the fast pace on the flat course in Cagliari. She then ran her way to third, holding off the fastcharging Cassandre Beaugrand of France, to finish the 1,500m swim, 40k bike and 10k run course in 1 hour, 47 minutes 36 seconds, in third place behind Great Britain's Georgia Taylor-Brown (1:46:43) and Emma Lombardi of France (1:47:06)." Also in Cagliari, NYAC teammates Summer Rappaport, Katie Zaferes, and Kirsten Kasper took seventh, 12th, and 17th places, respectively. On the men's side, the NYAC's Matt McElroy finished 37th in 1:41:15; Great Britain's Alex Yee won in 1:36:28. Click here for full results from Cagliari.



Judo - Laborde and Yonezuka Finish Seventh in Linz

Thursday, May 25th - Saturday, May 27th; Linz, Austria - The NYAC's Maria Laborde (-48kg) and Jack Yonezuka (-73kg) each finished seventh in their respective weights at the Grand Prix Upper Austria. After defeating Austria's Jacqueline Springer and Colombia's Erika Lasso by ippon in the first two rounds, Maria lost to Brazil's Natasha Ferreira by ippon in the quarter-final and to Italy's Francesca Milani by ippon in the repechage. Jack defeated Austria's Samuel Gassner and Italy's Luigi Centracchio by waza ari in his first two rounds but lost to Serbia's Filip Jovanovic by ippon in the quarter-final and to Marrakech's Hassan Doukkali by ippon in the repechage. The NYAC's Ari Berliner (-66kg), Dominic Rodriguez (-73kg), Nicholas Yonezuka (-81kg), Alex Knauf (-90kg), Nate Keeve (-100kg), Christian Konoval (+100kg), Angelica Delgado (-52kg), and Hannah Martin (-63kg) also competed in Austria but did not advance beyond their first matches. Track and Field - Allman Claims Discus Title at LA Grand Prix

Friday, May 26th - Saturday, May 27th; Los Angeles, CA - The NYAC's Valarie Allman, Tokyo 2020 Olympic discus champion, won the discus competition with a mark of 68.39m/224-4 at the 2023 USATF Los Angeles Grand Prix. Yaime Perez of Cuba took second with 63.93m/209-9, and fellow American Laulauga Tausaga took third with 60.34m/197-11. Also in Los Angeles, the NYAC's Rudy Winkler and Brooke Andersen each took second in the men's and women's hammer throw competitions, respectively. On the men's side, Wojciech Nowicki of Poland won with 77.18m/253-2, Rudy took second with 77.17m/253-2, and Ethan Katzberg of Canada took third with

75.28m/247-0. On the women's side, Camryn Rogers of Canada won with 78.62m/257-11, Brooke took second with 76.06m/249-6, and the NYAC's **DeAnna Price** took third with 75.89m/248-11. Additionally, the NYAC's **Janeah Stewart** finished sixth with a mark of 70.31m/230-8. In the men's javelin, the NYAC's **Michael Shuey** took fifth with a mark of 70.54m/234-8. Tori Franklin's mark of 14.22m/46-8 was a season's best; Leyanis Perez Hernandez of Cuba won the women's triple jump with a world lead and personal best of 14.84m/48-8 1/4.
