Boxer Omari Jones Selected for Paris 2024



Sunday, March 3rd - Monday, March 11th; Busto Arsizio, Italy - By claiming victory in last weekend's Olympic Games World Qual-<u>ifying Tournament</u>,in Busto Arsizio, Italy, the NYAC's **Omari Jones** (-71kg) earned selection to represent Team USA at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games. Jones, thus, becomes the fifth NYAC athlete to have gained selection for the Paris Olympic and Paralympic Games, joining Taylor Knibb (triathlon), Morgan Pearson (triathlon), Jess Davis (modern pentathlon) and Tatyana McFadden (Paralympic marathon) on the US team. Jones powered through the competition in Italy, scoring a unanimous victory over Iran's Maghsoudi Mal Amiri Moslem in his penultimate bout, before advancing to the final, where he faced 2023 World Championships bronze medalist Nishant Dev of India. A win there would secure his ticket to Paris. Brian Taylor of USA Boxing takes up the story: "Omari Jones closed the day off on a high note to punch his ticket to this summer's Olympic Games with his 4-1 victory over India's Nishant Dev. Jones jumped out to an early 5-0 lead after the first round after strong use of his jab and defense; however, Dev came back to take four out of the five judges' cards in the second round. With a spot in Paris on the line, Jones would not let a cut he sustained during the round end his dream, and he came away victorious following another impressive round with strong use of his jab and sidestep. "I am officially an

Olympian," an emotional Jones said following his bout. "First off, all glory to God. This is for the kids in Orlando, and it is to show them that it is possible and that you can do it. I thought it was impossible at one

Judo - Yonezuka Claims Bronze in Linz



Friday, March 8th – Sunday, March 10th; Linz, Austria – Jack Yonezuka was the NYAC's top finisher at last weekend's Upper Austria Grand Prix, claiming a magnificent bronze medal in the -73kg division. Yonezuka, thus, became the first US man to win a Grand Prix medal in two years. The win also saw him climb to #15 on the filtered Olympic Ranking List; the top 17 in each weight category, as of June 25th, earn places at the Paris Olympic Games. After defeating France's Luca Otmane and UAE's Karim Abdulaev by waza ari in the rounds of 32 and 16, respectively, (the latter match going to sudden death overtime), Yonezuka lost to Morocco's Hassan Doukkali in the quarter-final, getting pinned in the third minute. From there, Yonezuka handily won the repechage against Brazil's Junior Pan Am bronze medalist, Vinicius Ardina, scoring ippon in the opening minute and ad-

vancing to the bronze medal match against European U23 champion Koen Heg from the Netherlands. Again, the NYAC man was dominant, pinning Heg for ippon and an instant win within the first minute. This was Yonezuka's sixth international podium finish within the last year and a significant improvement on his seventh place finish here last year. In addition to Yonezuka, the NYAC's Angie Delgado (-52kg), Nate Keeve (-100kg), Hannah Martin (-63kg) and Dominic Rodriguez (-81kg) contested their respective weights, but none advanced beyond the round of 16. Triathlon - Pearson Victorious in Miami, Looking Towards Paris

Friday, March 8th; Miami, FL - The NYAC's Morgan Pearson, Tokyo 2020 silver medalist in the triathlon mixed relay, scored a superb victory in the Americas Triathlon Championships Miami with a finishing time of 1:43.39, giving him a 15 second win over countryman, Darr Smith. Pearson's splits were: 18:17 for the 1500m swim, 52:47 for the 39.84K bike, and 31:29 for the 10K run. Pearson's run was the fastest of the entire field. Tomos Land of Tri 247 called the NYAC man "flawless" in his first race of the season and reported "[i]n a huge field of over 80 athletes, the former Colorado University Buff was in control throughout, leading off the bike in the main pack before unleashing his trademark run speed to take a comfortable win. Opting to miss the first WTCS race of the year in Abu Dhabi, which ended up being cancelled, now looks to be a stroke of genius from the American, after he managed to test his legs without the rigamarole of a long haul flight. If he can stay healthy, Pearson is without a doubt one of the contenders for a medal in the individual race in Paris, and will surely also be looking to upgrade his silver medal from the mixed team relay in Tokyo." Another NYAC Paris Olympic hopeful, Katie Zaferes, a two time medalist from Tokyo, did not fare so well, suffering in the heat on the run leg and failing to finish. While this result does not eradicate Zaferes' hopes of getting to Paris, it does make the task considerably more difficult. Click here for complete results from Miami.
