NYAC MEDAL HAUL AT PAN-AMERICAN GAMES

Friday, October 20th – Sunday, November 5th; Santiago, Chile - As of today, Friday, November 3rd, NYAC athletes have claimed 17 medals at the 2023 Pan-American Games, including five since the last installment of the *Athletics News* on Friday, October 27th. In addition to the 11 swimming medals claimed by Paige Madden and Catie De-Loof, details of which can be found in the October 27th *Athletics News*, Deanna Price claimed a gold medal in the women's hammer throw, Matt McElroy, a silver in the men's triathlon, Jess Davis and Brendan Anderson, bronze medals in the modern pentathlon mixed relay, and Maria Laborde (-48kg), Angie Delgado (-52), and Alex Knauf (-90kg), bronze medals in their respective judo weights. TRACK AND FIELD: Wednesday, November 1st -

Deanna Price was crowned as the 2023 Pan-Am Games hammer throw champion with a mark of 72.34m, which she achieved on her first attempt of the competition and which she matched on her sixth and final attempt of the competition. Venezuela's Rosa Rodriguez took second with 71.59m, and Canada's Kaila Butler rounded out the podium with 65.10m. Thursday, November 2nd – Rob Napolitano and Aisha Praught-Leer finished fourth and sixth, in the men's 1500m (3:40.12) and women's 5000m (16:23.06), re-

spectively. Charles Philibert-Thiboutot of Canada won the men's 1500m in 3:39.74, and Joselyn Brea of Venezuela won the women's 5000m in 16:04.12. **Sunday, October 29th - Nick Christie** and **Emmanuel Corvera** finished 13th and 14th, respectively, in the 20K race walk. Christie claimed his 13th place finish in 1:30:00, and Emmanuel Corvera claimed his 14th place finish in 1:36:21. Ecuador's Alexander David Hurtado won the race in 1:19:20. *UPCOMING*: On Saturday, November 4th, **Rudy Winkler** will contest the hammer throw final.

TRIATHLON: Thursday, November 2nd – Matt McElroy claimed the men's triathlon silver medal with a finish of 1:46:09, losing to winner Miguel Lopes Hidalgo of Brazil (1:46:08) by one second. Mexico's Crisanto Grajales was close behind and claimed the bronze medal in 1:46:11. **UPCOMING:** On Saturday, November 4th, **McElroy** will race the mixed relay.

JUDO: Saturday, October 28th – Tuesday, October 31st – Maria Laborde (-48kg), Angie Delgado (-52kg), and Alex Knauf (-90kg) each claimed bronze medals in their respective weights. At -48kg, Maria Laborde defeated Erika Lasso Arias of Colombia in the bronze medal match to claim the -48kg medal. At -52kg, Angie Delgado defeated Francine Echevarria Lemus of Puerto Rico in the bronze medal match to claim her -52kg medal. At -90kg, Alex Knauf defeated Mariano Coto of Argentina in the bronze medal match to claim his medal. Also in Santiago, the NYAC's Nate Keeve advanced as far as the repechage at -100kg where he was defeated by Liester Cardona of Cuba.

MODERN PENTATHLON: Wednesday, October 25th –

Jess Davis and Brendan Anderson claimed bronze

medals in the mixed relay competition with 1328 points.

Mexico's Tamara Vega and Manuel Padilla won with 1360

points, and Ecuador's Sol Naranjo and Andres Torres

claimed silver with 1335 points.

WRESTLING: Thursday, November 2nd – Erin Golston advanced as far as the bronze medal match at 50kg before losing to Mariana Rojas of Venezuela, 0-3.

UPCOMING: **Zach Braunagel** will contest the Greco-Roman 87kg division on Saturday, November 4th.

WATER POLO: The water polo competitions are still underway at the 2023 Pan-American Games, and as of writing,

the US men and women are still in contention for Pan Am titles. On Thursday, November 2nd, the US men's team, with the NYAC's **Alex Obert, Alex Bowen, and Max Irving** beat host nation Chile, 28-3, in the quarter-final to advance to the semi-final which will be on Friday, November 3rd at 6:30pm. On Friday, November 3rd, the US women's team, with the NYAC's **Ashleigh Johnson, Tara Prentice, Rachel Fattal, Maggie Steffens, Jordan Raney, Kaleigh Gilchrist, Ava Johnson, Bayley Weber, and Amanda Longan** defeated Argentina, 27-1, in the semi-final to advance to the final. The final, where the US women will face Canada, will be on Saturday, November 4th at 11:30am.
