McFadden Claims Silver at NYC Marathon



Sunday, November 3rd; New York, NY – The NYAC's **Tatyana McFadden**, the most decorated US track and field Paralympian of all time and five-time NYC Marathon champion, took second in the wheelchair division of the New York City Marathon with a finish of 1:58:47. Fellow American Susannah Scaroni won in 1:48:05, and Switzerland's Manuela Schar took third in 1:59:20. On the race, Ken Belson of the New York Times reported, "Scaroni, who set a course record when she won the race in 2022, led from the start. She had a half-minute lead over McFadden, a fellow American, through 5 kilometers and expanded the gap to more than 2 minutes by the 10-kilometer mark. By the race's midway point, her lead had ballooned to more than four and a half minutes," and by the conclusion of the race, Scaroni claimed the victory by over ten minutes. Also at the NYC Marathon, the NYAC's road racing squad finished third overall, clocking 7:17:34 for its top three runners, behind winner Boston Athletic Club (7:07:14) and second place Front Runners NY

(7:16:00). The NYAC's **Owen Ritz** was the club's top performer with a 25th place finish in 2:17:16. **Sean Swift** took 83rd in 2:28:27, and **John Bleday** finished 140th in 2:31:51. Swimming - Douglass Secures World Cup Title

Thursday, October 31st – Saturday, November 2nd; Singapore – As reported in last week's Athletics News, **Kate Douglass** had a remarkable performance at the World Aquatics Swimming World Cup in Singapore, breaking her own 200m breaststroke world record, clocking a 2:12.72, and also winning the 100m medley (56.57). On Saturday, November 2nd, Kate added another win to her Singapore record in the 100m freestyle (50.82). Hong Kong's Siobhan Haughey took second in 51.56, and Poland's Katarzyna Wasick took third in 52.04. With the conclusion of the three-stop World Aquatics World Cup tour, Kate Douglass came out on top for point total (178.5 points) and prize winnings. Additionally, she secured three triple crowns – sweeps of single events across all three meet stops – in the 200m breaststroke, 50m butterfly, and 100m individual medley. Fellow American Regan Smith took second in the standings with 178.4 points, and Hong Kong's Siobhan Haughey took third with 160.7 points. [Click here](#) to learn more about Kate's accomplishment.



Triathlon - Results from Neom

Saturday, November 2nd; Neom, Saudi Arabia – The NYAC's **Vincent Luis**, Tokyo 2020 Olympic bronze, finished seventh at the Supertri Neom Grand Final with a finish of 49:08. The unique race format consisted of three back-to-back triathlons (300m swim – 4K bike – 1.6K run) without breaks between. To add to the action, athletes were eliminated mid-race, if they fell more than 90 seconds behind the leader at any point. Great Britain's Alex Yee won the race in 48:27, Kiwi Hayden Wilde took second in 48:27, and France's Leo Bergere took third in 48:28. With the conclusion of the 2024 Supertri season, the final men's standings were as follows – (1) Hayden Wilde (62 points), (2) Leo Bergere (55 points), (3) Tim Hellwig (49 points). On the women's side, the NYAC's **Taylor Spivey** took eighth with a finish of 54:07, and **Kirsten Kasper** took 13th but was eliminated in the process. France's Cassandre Beaugrand won in 53:26, Luxembourg's Jeanne Lehair took second in 53:34, and France's Leonie Periault took third in 53:46. The final women's standings were as follows – (1) Georgia Taylor-Brown (59 points), (2) Jeanne Lehair (57 points), (3) Cassandre Beaugrand (56 points). [Click here](#) for full results from Neom.
