Bronze For Hildebrandt



Saturday, September 10th – Sunday, September 18th; Belgrade, Serbia – In a thrilling bout against 2019 world championships silver medalist, Emilia Vuc of Romania, the NYAC's #1 ranked Sarah Hildebrandt won the 50kg bronze medal at the World Wrestling Championships in Belgrade with a 10-0 technical fall. The bout was not without high drama. After scoring a pair of takedowns early on to lead 4-0, Vuc caught Hildebrandt in an illegal headlock, choking her out and forcing the NYAC woman to lose consciousness. Vuc was penalized two points and medical staff came to Hildebrandt's aid. After recovering, she fought on to score three more takedowns, securing the technical fall late in the second period. In taking the bronze medal, Hildebrandt boosted her major championships medal tally to four: a 2020 Olympic bronze medal, two world championships silvers (2018, 2021), plus this most recent bronze. Triathlon - Podium Performances from McElroy, Rappaport & Spivey

Sunday, September 11th; Karlovy Vary, Czech Republic – The NYAC's Matt McElroy and Summer Rappaport claimed medals at the World Triathlon Cup Karlovy Vary. In a race in which the run segment determined everything, McElroy took the silver behind Csongor Lehmann of Hungary, with respective times of 1:51:10 and 1:51:20. You can see excellent highlights of the race here. On the women's side, Leonie Periault of France scored a dominant win in 2:05:04 with Rappaport third in 2:06:29. For full results from Karlovy Vary, click here. • Sunday, September 11th; Munich, Germany - The NYAC's Taylor Spivey placed third at the Super League Triathlon Championship Series Munich, an "Enduro" style race, with competitors completing a 300m swim, 4K bike and 1.6K run three successive times. Great Britons Georgia Taylor-Brown and Sophie Coldwell went one-two, with Spivey just losing out in a sprint finish with the latter, a woman she had defeated one week previously in London. Track and Field - NYAC Throwers Taking on the World

Friday, September 9th – Sunday, September 11th; Zagreb, Croatia – The NYAC secured three second place finishes in throws events at the Memorial Boris Hanzekovica, a World Athletics Continental Tour gold meet. The NYAC's **Joe Kovacs**, who, the previous week, had become the second farthest thrower in history, took second in the shot put with a mark of 21.97m/72-1. The 2022 world champion Ryan Crouser, having been striken with Covid following his world championships win, won the event with a mark of 22.19m/72-9.75, turning the tables from their previous clash. In the women's discus, the NYAC's Olympic champion, **Valarie Allman**, placed second with a throw of 67.55m/221-7, giving best to hometown favorite, two-time Olympic champion Sandra Perkovic, who prevailed with a mark of 68.46m/224-7. The third NYAC thrower of the meet was **Sam Mattis** in the discus, who completed the second-place trifecta with a throw of 67.19m/220-5, behind the winning 68.60m/225-1 of Slovenia's Kristjan Ceh of Slovenia. For complete results from Zagreb, **Click here**. • **Monday, September 12th; Ticino, Switzerland** – One day after the Zagreb meet, **Joe Kovacs** traveled to Switzerland for the Gala dei Castell, where he continued his rivalry with Ryan Crouser. This time, it was Kovacs' turn on the top step, taking the shot put win with a throw of 22.19m85-1.25. Crouser took second at 22.00m/72-2.25. All the results from Ticino are **here**.
