

Paris 2024 Selection

Wrestlers Sarah Hildebrandt and Adam Coon Secure Spots

Friday, April 19th - Saturday, April 20th; State College, PA - A thrilling US Olympic Trials this past weekend in State College, PA saw NYAC wrestlers Sarah Hildebrandt (WFS 50kg) and Adam Coon (GR 130kg) secure spots at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games. Hildebrandt and Coon join 16 other NYAC athletes who have already been selected for the Games, which begin on Friday, July 26th in the French capital. Hildebrandt, a Granger, IN native, is a Tokyo 2020 bronze medalist, two-time world championships silver medalist (2018 - 53kg; 2021 - 50kg), a two-time world championships 50kg bronze medalist (2022, 2023), and a 2019 53kg Pan-Am Games champion. At the State College Trails, she produced a dominant performance, clinching the victory after a 10-0, 10-0 championship match victory over 18-year-old phenom, Audrey Jimenez, from Tucson, AZ. According to Tim Creason of the South Bend Tribune, "....Hildebrandt is still haunted by the memory of her [Tokyo] Olympic semi-final, when she gave up what looked like a sure victory in the last 10 seconds [...] It took some time, but Hildebrandt realized she still has a burning desire - call it a need - to win a gold medal." Her victory in State College gives Hildebrandt the opportunity to actualize her dream in Paris. Also heading to Paris is Adam Coon, a Fowlerville, MI native and 2018 130kg Greco-Roman world championships silver medalist. In one of the biggest upsets of the Trials, Coon defeated three-time world championships team member Cohlton Schultz to claim the 130 Greco-Roman spot for the Paris Games. After losing to Schultz by decision in the first bout, 3-1, Coon came back and won the second round by decision, 1-1, and the third, also by decision, 6-1. In one of the greatest upsets of the Trials, legendary NYAC wrestler, Adeline Gray, six-time world champion ('12, '14, '15, '18, '19, '21), two-time Olympian (2016, 2020) and Tokyo 2020 76kg silver medalist, failed to qualify for her third Olympics after falling to Wyomin

Track & Field - Allman Claims Win at Diamond League Xiamen



Saturday, April 20th; Xiamen, China – The NYAC's Valarie Allman won the discus competition at the <u>Diamond League Xiamen Meeting</u> with a mark of 69.80m/229-0, the #8 mark in the world in the past 30 years, defeating Cuba's Yaime Perez (68.83m/225-10) and China's Bin Feng (67.07m/220-0), the 2022 world champion. Just one week prior, on April 13th, Perez had recorded the #9 all-time global mark of 73.09m239-9 in Ramona, OK. Allman's American record of 71.46m234-5, set on April 8th, 2022, is the #16 all-time global mark. To hear Allman's comments following her win in Xiamen, click here. Also in Xiamen, NYAC pole vaulter Chris Nilsen, the Tokyo 2020 silver medalist, placed equal sixth with a mark of 5.42m/17-9.5, tied with Ben Broeders of Belgium and fellow American, Jacob Wooten. Sweden's indomitable Mondo Duplantis took the victory with a stunning new world record of 6.24m/20-5.75, breaking his own previous mark of 6.23m20-5.25, set in September 2023. Click here for full results from Xiamen. • Sunday, April 21st; Antalya, Turkey – NYAC racewalkers Nick Christie (and partner Robyn Stevens), Emmanuel Corvera and Celine Lepe, and Miranda Melville (and partner Jordan Crawford), finished 41st, 57th, and 58th, respectively, in the Marathon Race Walk Mixed Relay at the World Athletics Race Walking Team Championships. Italy's Francesco Fortunato and Valentina Trapletti won in a time of 2:57:45. The top 22 teams secured automatic qualification for the Paris Games; those outside the top 22 still have the opportunity to qualify through the World Athletics marathon race walk mixed relay performance list. An additional three teams will be selected from this list upon the conclusion of the qualification period, ending on Sunday, June 30th. The marathon race walk mixed relay is a new addition to the Olympic program. Two person teams (one man, one woman) complete two legs each, alternating in this order: male 11.45km, female 10km, female 10km, female 10.745km. Click

Velaasa's Rachel Tanczos won with 69.26m/227-3. Michael Shuey finished seventh in the javelin with a mark of 69.97m/229-6; Team Sparta Denmark's Arthur Petersen won with 79.73m/261-7.
