

NYAC Swimmers Claim 17 World Championships Medals

Friday, February 2nd - Sunday, February 18th; Doha, Qatar – To conclude the *Athletics News* coverage of the 2024 World Aquatics Championships, NYAC swimmers Kate Douglass, Hunter Armstrong, and Nic Fink had dominant performances, claiming 17 medals in total, with eight gold medals, three silvers, and six bronzes. Individual world titles were secured by Kate Douglass (200m IM, 2:07.05, on 2/12), Nic Fink (100m BS, 58.57, on 2/12) and Hunter Armstrong (100m Back, 52.68; on 2/13). The three stellar NYAC swimmers, along with US teammate Claire Curzan, claimed the world title for Team USA in the mixed 4x100m medley relay in a time of 3:40.22 on February 15th. Additionally, Hunter Armstrong and Nic Fink, with fellow US teammates, claimed the world title in the men's 4x100m medley relay in a time of 3:29.80 on 2/18. In addition to their world titles, NYAC swimmers also claimed the following medals. Kate Douglass secured silvers in 200m BS (2:20.91) on 2/16 and 50m FS (23.91) on 2/18, and a bronze in mixed 4x100m freestyle relay (3:22.28) on 2/17. Hunter Armstrong secured a silver in the 50m backstroke (24.33) on 2/18 and bronzes in 4x100m FS relay (3:12.29) on 2/11, 4x200 FS relay (7:02.08) on 2/16, and mixed 4x100m freestyle relay (3:22.28) on 2/17. Lastly, Nic Fink claimed bronzes in 50m BS (26.29) on 2/14 and 200m BS (2:08.85) on 2/16. Click here for complete swimming results from Doha.

Track and Field - NYAC National Champions



Friday, February 16th - Saturday, February 17th; Albuquerque, NM – NYAC athletes claimed four national titles at the 2024 USATF Indoor Championships this past weekend – Daniel Haugh in the weight throw, Chris Nilsen in the pole vault, Nick Christie in the men's 3000m race walk, and Miranda Melville in the women's 3000m race walk. Notably, Daniel Haugh won the weight throw with a mark of 26.35m/86-5.50, a new world record, breaking the former record (25.86m/84-10) set by the NYAC's own Lance Deal in 1995. Haugh achieved his winning mark on his fourth throw of the competition. Isaiah Rogers of Throw1Deep club took second with a personal best of 24.41m/80-1, and Tanner Berg took third with 23.41m/76-9.75. In the women's weight throw, the NYAC's Brooke Andersen took second with 24.35m/79-10.75 and Janeah

Stewart took third with 24.28m/79-8.25; Velaasa's Erin Reese won with a personal best of 25.73m/84-5. In the pole vault, with a meet record of 6.00/19-8.25, the NYAC's Chris Nilsen defeated two-time pole vault world champion (2017, 2019) Sam Kendricks to claim the national title. Kendricks took second with a season's best of 5.95m/19-6.25, and Austin Miller took third, equaling his personal best, with 5.90m/19-4.25. NYAC race walkers claimed both the men's and women's 3000m titles, with Nick Christie finishing in 11:56.06, and Miranda Melville in 13:55.24. The NYAC race walk action did not stop there – **Emmanuel Corvera** took second in the men's race in 12:47.14, and his wife and new NYAC roster addition, **Celina Lepe**, took fifth in the women's race in 14:33.38.
